# O BITUARY



Luther Walter Jackson Jr. was born on February 15, 1944 in Los Angeles, California to Luther and Angie Jackson. His mother affectionately called him "Little Luther," named after his dad. He was the youngest of his siblings, Ruby and Robert. As a family, they attended Pilgrim Baptist Church in Los Angeles where he first accepted Jesus Christ as his Lord and Savior. He attended Sunday School on a regular basis

where he made life-long friends. The foundation of the Gospel never left him. It carried him through some rough times in his life. Luther made it a priority to read the Bible and Daily Bread devotions on a regular basis.

Luther received a quality education from Los Angeles Unified School District. When he was a young child, he completed his primary education at Wadsworth Elementary School. As a teenager, he attended Carver Junior High School and Jefferson High School. During his high school years, he became popular for being funny, feisty, and handsome with pretty eyes and a cool walk. He participated on the school's track team as a long distance runner, ran on the cross country team, and played the trombone in the school band. After he graduated from high school in 1961, he studied welding at Los Angeles Trade Tech College and graduated in 1963 with an Associates degree.

Upon completing his college education, Luther obtained his first job at Angelus Electronics in El Monte, California. His most memorable career achievements have been working for McDonnell Douglas Aircraft throughout the 70's and 80's and Los Angeles Unified School District in the 90's until he retired in 2011. Even after he retired, he kept himself busy working as an apartment manager and did handy jobs for family and friends.




On October 25, 1985, Luther married Regina Love. Out of their union, was born their daughter, Lureon Jackson on September 21, 1986. Although Luther and






























































### EXPRESSIONS OF LOVE
